I am requesting funding for a Backup 9-1-1 Dispatch Center in Fiscal Year 2027. The entity to receive funding for this project is the City of Brea, located at 1 Civic Center Cir, Brea, CA 92821.

The funding would be used to complete the technology, equipment, and digital infrastructure needed for a fully operational backup 9-1-1 Dispatch Center and Emergency Operations Center in Brea, CA. The project is an appropriate use of taxpayer funds because the backup center will allow dispatchers to continue answering calls and coordinating emergency responses safely, without disruption, in the event of the primary dispatch center being rendered unusable. This project enables greater coordination among Orange County cities during emergencies, strengthens law enforcement technology, enhances officer safety, and improves real-time response capabilities.

The project has a federal nexus because the funding provided is for purposes described in section 1701(b)(9) of the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (34 U.S.C. § 10381(b)(9)).
